**2003 Spring Dance:** The 2003 Spring Dance is jointly sponsored by the RSCDS Chicago Branch and the Evanston Scottish Country Dancers. The dance will be held at the Winnetka Community House at 620 Lincoln Ave., Winnetka on Sunday April 6<sup>th</sup> starting at 4:00 p.m. It's a wonderful way to celebrate spring and dancing on Tartan Day! Admission is \$7.00 and the dance will be followed by a light tea – donations are welcome. The program and cheat sheets are available on the Branch website and the program is listed below. Directions to the venue are:

From 294 or 355: exit east on Willow Rd/Palatine Rd. (same road; name changes west of 294) to Green Bay Rd. Turn left on Green Bay (north) to Elm Street (immediately after the train station). Turn right onto Elm (east), go over the railroad tracks and turn left at the stop sign. Go about 100 yards to the parking lot entrance on the left. This is the lot behind the Community Center (there is construction and the rear entrance may not be accessible). Alternatively, continue to the stop sign and go left. There is another parking lot immediately to the left and another entrance to the first lot immediately before the train overpass.

From 94 (south): same directions as from 294. From the north: Exit at Tower Road and turn right from the exit to go back across the Edens. Go east to Green Bay and turn right to go south on Green Bay. Turn left onto Pine Street (east). The Winnetka Community House is the first building on the right.

From Sheridan Road (north or south): Go west on Elm Street to the second stop sign. Turn right and follow above directions to the parking lots.

The Union Pacific/North line is the train station one block south of the Winnetka Community House (Chicago to Kenosha).

**Note:** Daylight Savings time starts April 6<sup>th</sup>, so remember to set your clocks before going to bed and don't be late to the dance!

**Glass Slipper Project:** The 'Glass Slipper Project' (<http://www.glassslipperproject.org>) is an organization that collects ladies' gowns and ball accoutrements that people no longer have use for. Disadvantaged young women are invited to 'shop' to pick suitable prom clothes from the donations. The Branch invites you to bring donations to the Spring Dance.
